




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
Orange bars represent 2023 second quarter GBYS child age at enrollment Blue bars represent 2023 third quarter GBYS child age at enrollment





Racial identity of enrolled child




Early Intervention status at time of enrollment






## **Unilateral vs. Bilateral hearing loss**
