The Illinois Hands & Voices Guide By Your Side (ILHV GBYS) program provides unbiased emotional support and resources by trained Parent Guides to families with children who are deaf/hard of hearing.

Through IL Hands & Voices fundraising, personal donations and funding through the Illinois Early Hearing Detection and Intervention Program (EHDI), Illinois Hands & Voices Guide By Your Side is able to provide free services to families. Families can be referred to the program from providers or call directly to participate.

The Leveled Recognition program (LRP) has three levels: Guide, Lead and Senior. Promotions are achieved by completing activities and earning points from completed tasks.

The LRP is a directive of Hands & Voices HQ to help "supporting members" within our programs develop skills and grow in their leadership capacity.








Orange bars represent first quarter 2025 GBYS child age at enrollment Blue bars represent second quarter 2025 GBYS child age at enrollment






Pending enrollment means that the family has had contact with El and is working through the enrollment process.
